VEERA VANCHI

Exactly 100 years ago (17th June) at a dusty Railway station something of National relevance occurred. Did the Nation remember its heroic son ? 624 km away from Chennai is Maniyachi station – now named 'Vanchi Maniyachi Junction'. 100 years back, at 10.30 in the morning pistol sounded – there was commotion as the only killing of British Official in South India occurred – few minutes later – there were sounds of pistol again – this time the martyrdom of a youth – hardly 25 years of age did the supreme sacrifice of his life for the motherland.

This is not to eulogise the killing but the martyrdom needs to be extolled. Inspired by the Surat Congress in Dec 1907 the man who pioneered shipping – VO Chidambaram Pillai organised political meetings in Tuticorin and Tirunelveli. There were fiery speeches by Subramania Siva. The Freedom struggle spread and on Feb 1908, around 1000 workers struck work in the Coral Mills of Tuticorin. The collector Robert William Escourt Ashe had imposed restriction by Sec 144 and the union of workers was not to his liking. When the patriotic leaders planned to celebrate release of Bipin Chanda Pal as Swarajya day – violence was unleashed by the Dist Admn. VOC, Siva, Padmanabha Iyengar were arrested in Mar 1908. There were riots in Tuticorin and Tirunelveli termed as incendiarism.

Robert Ashe had been born in 1872 in Ireland. In 1895, he arrived in India, where he began his career as an Assistant Collector and rose up to be District Magistrate and Collector. In 1907 he had his posting in Tirunelveli. To avenge for all the harms he posed, Ashe was shot dead point blank at 10.38 when rain halted at Maniyachi.

Vanchinathan belonged to Bharatha Matha Association. He was born in 1886 to Raghupathy Iyer and Rukmani Ammal. His actual name was Shankaran. He graduated in M.A. from Thiruvananthapuram. Even while in college, he married Ponnammal and got into a lucrative Government job. The timing of the assassination indicated a protest against the impending coronation. A massive manhunt followed the assassination. Sadly, it was reported that even his last rites were not performed. 14 persons were arrested and charged with conspiracy. More deaths were to follow as two committed suicide - Dharmaraja Aiyar took poison, while Venkateswara Aiyar slit his own throat. Madasamy, widely believed to be Vanchi's accomplice and who was seen running away after the assassination, was never traced. In a Court of Justice in the colonial context there were testimony of approvers who perhaps were threatened and there was panic amongst the freedom fighters as they feared strict action. What happened to the family of Veera Vanchinathan is not documented but there cannot be any doubt that his lineage would have suffered chill penury and were left uncared for – they would have been hounded by the British and after India obtained freedom, nobody ever cared for them.

Indians exhibited their loyalty immediately after the killing by erecting two memorials – one at the place where Ashe was interred and another a mantap at Great Cotton Road in Tuticorin – the subscription for this was collected from Indians.

The life history of the Great Patriot Vanchinathan is not found in any great detail in the history books and not many remember him. In his birthplace Sengottai [Shencottah] in the foothills of Western Ghats closer to Tenkasi / Courtallam, a statue was erected during the regime of CM MGR. In the movie Kappalottiya Tamizhan, Actor Balaji played the role of Vanchinathan. Long Live Bharat Mata and Long Live the Martyrs who gave everything to make us live the way that we are doing today.....

With tears thinking of the Great son of India and recalling his sacrifice for his wonderful motherland.

We have organized various Medical camps but this one on 26th June 2011 was different. This time it was for school children. SYMA along with Nandalala Trust and Lions Club of South Madras organized a health camp at NKT National Boys High School.

Around 110 students were screened for ENT, Dental and Eye care. 6 of them were prescribed spectacles which were provided to them in the camp. The camp was well organized by Sadagopan MA ably assisted by all our volunteers.

We place on record our special thanks to Dr V Shankar Kumar, Suraksha ENT Care, Unit of Nandalala Medical Foundation, Dr KM Vidhya and to all staff of Sankara Eye Hospital, Pammal. Its CEO Mr J Babu has been of great help to us in many of our endeavours and we specially thank him for the assistance in conducting eye check-up.

SYMA GROWTH

A Social Service Organisation's objective is to help the society. We want better citizens. We want to inculcate in them great qualities and we felt the need for taking care of those students who are on the margin and would not succeed if no personal attention is provided. It is also a matter of fact, that many of these children hail from economically underprivileged sections and cannot afford to have private tuitions. Poverty, hunger, suffering are all the same – irrespective of caste, creed, community or religion. We have in our earlier years arranged for tuition closer to examinations to take care of those children who dreaded the examinations but any last minute work is only half good. We have been debating on this and contemplating on providing a secure solution.

Thus our idea of a professionally run tuition centre was born. Here we wanted to have Instructors who are in tune with the modern ways of teaching and are already in touch with the present day syllabus. We also wanted to select students who we felt were average or on the margin – just wanting to be nurtured and cared for.

A couple of years back on 6th July 2008, on a very auspicious day – SYMA Growth was born. It was inaugurated at NKT National Girls Higher Secondary School, Triplicane by Shri R Sekar, IPS, (the then) Commissioner of Police, Greater Chennai. From that day onwards, lots of SYMA volunteers have strained themselves to ensure success of the project.

We are not buoyed by the pass % alone, every year is a learning experience in relentless pursuit of our goal. This year we felt the need to ensure total commitment of the students and involvement of the parents also. The applications were processed on economic criteria and individual screening of every aspirant was conducted. We emphasized the need for timely and regular attendance, developing competitive spirit, studying with ambition and developing the traits of discipline and responsibility. This was conducted with a view to kindle the aspirations of the students and make them realize that their family would reach greater heights when they study well. We want the parents to be in regular touch with the Centre knowing the progress of their children.

Besides school curriculum, we plan to have Yoga, games etc., for their overall personality development. To ensure that students attend classes properly, a caution deposit has been collected. This would be refunded when they attend classes properly. To make them study well, we propose to distribute cash awards for those students who score marks above some set levels. Thus for the upliftment for those who have not had enough opportunities, we have created the necessary infrastructure, have arranged for quality education. We look forward to the students to avail this facility, come out with flying colours not only by securing good marks also by developing into good responsible citizens.

No words can describe our gratitude to all our dedicated teachers, the management of NK Thirumalachariar Educational Trust and NKT Boys Higher School. We thank the NKT Management for providing us the infrastructure and all the support. We thank Smt. Leela Sekhar, Secretary of NKT Trust and the Head master of the School Mr S Venkatadri.

Our Special thanks are also due to many of you who have donated to us in good measure. Together we will certainly make it happen.

EDUCATIONAL AID PROGRAMME

For over two decades now, we have been providing new uniforms to poor students. Last year around 1200 students received uniforms from us. Every year in our Function, besides distribution of uniforms we have been honouring the school toppers of various schools in Triplicane, extend financial assistance to some students and honour a good social worker with 'SYMA Sewa Award'.

The number of students who seek uniforms is increasing year after year and that requires more money. It is a hard truth that there are many school children who manage with just one set of uniform throughout the year, that too hard to come by. We strongly believe that we can make some difference to the way these unfortunate children attend their school. This year we plan to provide Uniforms to 1200 students for which we have evolved systems to ensure that the benefits reach properly.
